(Questions and Scriptures for further study)

1. Read Psalm 90 and consider how the author brings our short lives clearly into perspective. What does this passage suggest about how you can find meaning in your short years here on earth?

What's one proactive decision you can make today that will make this day count for eternity? Are you willing to act upon that decision? Why or why not?

2. Many times, we hang on till the new year to make changes in our life. Thus, the new year is a time for new goals and resolutions. What's also true is that most resolutions don't last for more than a few weeks. The good news is that God is working year-round and can help us bring about change more than we can on our own. How do the following verses further illustrate this idea of God working in us to bring about change?

2 Corinthians 5:17 Romans 6:4 Hebrews 12:3-11 James 1:21-25

Can you think of any ways you've changed because of God's work in your life?

3. Read Philippians 2:5-8 and Proverbs 3:6. There are really only two things that shape my character, the Word of God and the Problems we encounter. Which one has been the most effective teacher in your life? What is the correlation between humility and learning? Is there a verse that you can think of that addresses this truth?

What life lesson is God trying to teach you presently? Why are you still yet learning, and have not learned? What needs to change?

4. Read John 15:1-5. Are you trying to change with willpower or God's power? What do these verses imply about the key to growth? How do you "abide" in Christ? How can you do this more continuously, starting today?
