2. What excites you most about heaven? What do you see as the most intriguing attribute about heaven?
3. What's the hardest aspect of the doctrine of hell for you to accept? Think about this statement ... “The Fear of hell is not enough to keep you out of it”? Do you agree? Why or Why not?
4. Read John 15:18-24. This passage helps us to understand that Jesus judges people based on what they know, not on what they don't know? They hated Jesus because they did not know what/who? (vs. 21) Because Christ came, they now know what? (vs. 22) Their response to Christ was likely because of what?
5. Read Luke 16:19-31. What does the story of the rich man and Lazarus teach us about eternity? Who are the people in the passage? What does the story tell us about the people? Does the story give us any hint as to why the people ended up where they did? What aspect of the story speaks to you most?
6. Does the reality of an eternity without Christ (and without love) motivate you to introduce more people to Christ? If so, why. And if not, why not? This week, spend some time praying for friends who are on the verge of rejecting Christ or who have rejected Christ. Ask God to help your share Christ's love for them, and to invite them maybe even to Church next week.
